

Genesis — Worksheet 2: Answer Key

Noah & the Flood — marking guide

Use this to mark your own worksheet. For reflection questions, there is no single right answer — check that your response genuinely engages with the passage.

1. Why did God decide to send a flood upon the earth (Genesis 6:5-7)?

Because the wickedness of humankind had become great and every inclination of their hearts was continually evil.

2. What set Noah apart from the rest of his generation (Genesis 6:8-9)?

Noah found grace/favour with God and was described as righteous and blameless, walking with God.

3. What did God command Noah to bring into the ark (Genesis 6:18-20)?

His family, and two of every kind of living creature (male and female) to keep them alive.

4. How long did the flood waters prevail upon the earth (Genesis 7:24)?

150 days.

5. What promise did God make after the flood, and what sign did He give (Genesis 9:11-13)?

God promised never again to destroy all life by a flood, and gave the rainbow as the sign of that covenant.

6. Reflection: What does the rainbow covenant teach us about God's patience and mercy toward humanity?

Open reflection — look for engagement with themes of mercy, patience, and God keeping promises.
