

# Leviticus — Worksheet 1: Answer Key

The Sacrificial System — marking guide

Use this to mark your own worksheet. For reflection questions, there is no single right answer — check that your response genuinely engages with the passage.

## 1. What was required for a burnt offering, according to Leviticus 1:3-4?

A male without blemish, offered at the door of the tabernacle, with the offerer's hand laid on its head to make atonement.

## 2. What day is described in Leviticus 16, and what was its purpose (Leviticus 16:29-30)?

The Day of Atonement — a day to afflict the soul and be cleansed from all sins before the LORD, once a year.

## 3. What happened to the 'scapegoat' on the Day of Atonement (Leviticus 16:21-22, summarise)?

The high priest confessed the people's sins over it, and it was sent away into the wilderness, symbolically carrying their sin away.

## 4. Why might a whole system of sacrifices have been necessary before Christ, in a way it no longer is afterward?

Accept answers noting Christians believe Christ's sacrifice fulfilled and completed what these repeated offerings pointed toward (see Hebrews 10:1-14).

## 5. Reflection: Does understanding the seriousness with which sin was treated in Leviticus change how you think about forgiveness through Christ?

Open, personal reflection.
