The Character of God — marking guide

Use this to mark your own worksheet. For reflection questions, there is no single right answer — check that your response genuinely engages with the passage.

## 1. How is God described at the start of Nahum, in verses 2-3?

Jealous, avenging, furious against His adversaries, yet slow to anger and great in power.

## 2. What reassurance is given in Nahum 1:7?

'The LORD is good, a strong hold in the day of trouble; and he knoweth them that trust in him.'

## 3. Why might a book largely about judgement on Nineveh also include this note of comfort?

Accept answers noting God's justice toward the oppressor and His comfort toward the oppressed are two sides of the same character.

## 4. Reflection: Nahum holds together God's justice and His goodness in the same passage. Do you find those two ideas easy or hard to hold together?
