3. How is the day of the Lord described in 2 Peter 3:10?

4. Reflection: 2 Peter 3:9 reframes delay as patience rather than absence. Is there an area where you've mistaken God's patience for God's silence or inaction?

2 Peter 3:8-10

⁸But, beloved, be not ignorant of this one thing, that one day is with the Lord as a thousand years, and a thousand years as one day. ⁹The Lord is not slack concerning his promise, as some men count slackness; but is longsuffering to us-ward, not willing that any should perish, but that all should come to repentance.

¹⁰But the day of the Lord will come as a thief in the night; in the which the heavens shall pass away with a great noise, and the elements shall melt with fervent heat, the earth also and the works that are therein shall be burned up.
