Daniel in the Lions' Den

Read the passages on the back of this sheet (or use the biblestudy.fyi TTS Bible Player) before you begin. Answer in your own words on the lines provided.

1. What law did jealous officials convince King Darius to sign (Daniel 6:7-9, summarise)?

2. How did Daniel respond once he knew about the law (Daniel 6:10)?

3. What did the king do once Daniel was thrown into the lions' den, and what did he say to Daniel the next morning (Daniel 6:16-20)?

4. What had kept the lions from harming Daniel (Daniel 6:22)?

5. Reflection: Daniel kept his usual habit of prayer even under threat. What daily habits of faith matter enough to you that you'd keep them even under pressure?

Scripture for Daniel — Daniel in the Lions' Den

King James Version. Flip back to the front to answer the questions.

Daniel 6:10-11

¹⁰Now when Daniel knew that the writing was signed, he went into his house; and his windows being open in his chamber toward Jerusalem, he kneeled upon his knees three times a day, and prayed, and gave thanks before his God, as he did aforetime. ¹¹Then these men assembled, and found Daniel praying and making supplication before his God.

Daniel 6:16-23

¹⁶Then the king commanded, and they brought Daniel, and cast him into the den of lions. Now the king spake and said unto Daniel, Thy God whom thou servest continually, he will deliver thee. ¹⁷And a stone was brought, and laid upon the mouth of the den; and the king sealed it with his own signet, and with the signet of his lords; that the purpose might not be changed concerning Daniel. ¹⁸Then the king went to his palace, and passed the night fasting: neither were instruments of musick brought before him: and his sleep went from him. ¹⁹Then the king arose very early in the morning, and went in haste unto the den of lions. ²⁰And when he came to the den, he cried with a lamentable voice unto Daniel: and the king spake and said to Daniel, O Daniel, servant of the living God, is thy God, whom thou servest continually, able to deliver thee from the lions? ²¹Then said Daniel unto the king, O king, live for ever. ²²My God hath sent his angel, and hath shut the lions' mouths, that they have not hurt me: forasmuch as before him innocency was found in me; and also before thee, O king, have I done no hurt. ²³Then was the king exceeding glad for him, and commanded that they should take Daniel up out of the den. So Daniel was taken up out of the den, and no manner of hurt was found upon him, because he believed in his God.
