# Scripture for Nehemiah — Rebuilding the Walls

King James Version. Flip back to the front to answer the questions.

## Nehemiah 2:17-18

<sup>17</sup>Then said I unto them, Ye see the distress that we are in, how Jerusalem lieth waste, and the gates thereof are burned with fire: come, and let us build up the wall of Jerusalem, that we be no more a reproach. <sup>18</sup>Then I told them of the hand of my God which was good upon me; as also the king's words that he had spoken unto me. And they said, Let us rise up and build. So they strengthened their hands for this good work.

## Nehemiah 4:6-9

<sup>6</sup>So built we the wall; and all the wall was joined together unto the half thereof: for the people had a mind to work. <sup>7</sup>But it came to pass, that when Sanballat, and Tobiah, and the Arabians, and the Ammonites, and the Ashdodites, heard that the walls of Jerusalem were made up, and that the breaches began to be stopped, then they were very wroth, <sup>8</sup>And conspired all of them together to come and to fight against Jerusalem, and to hinder it. <sup>9</sup>Nevertheless we made our prayer unto our God, and set a watch against them day and night, because of them.
